What's the process of planning a round-the-world trip?

Determine your wishes

Take a moment to reflect on why you want to embark on this adventure. Is it the thrill of exploring new cultures, the desire to break free from your routine, or perhaps a quest for personal growth? Pinning down your motivations will help you craft a world itinerary that's more than just a checklist of destinations.

Chooseyour destinations

This is one of the tougher choices. List a number of destinations or countries and divide them as follows:

- **1. Must do & must see:** These countries must be included in your route.
- **2. Fillers:** These are destinations that you want to see provided that they are on the

route, they fit into your schedule and your travel budget allows it. They are, as it were, the fillers of your must do/must see route.

3. Reserves: Destinations from the reserve list are places that you can also visit another time, for example during a two-week holiday.

Book a World Ticket

Once you have created a route for yourself, you can see if one of our world trip routes is similar to this one. These routes also have world tickets attached to them. Handy, because this way you immediately get an idea of what is possible and how much such a world ticket costs. Changing or adding destinations to an existing world ticket is possible. In addition, you can make an appointment to have a world ticket customized 100%.



The Process

Save up for your big trip

The most frequently asked question when planning a trip: what budget should I think of? Unfortunately, there is no general formula to calculate your budget. Many factors play a role, from your personal situation and wishes to the travel time, your preference for comfort, and so on.

To give you a guideline, we have made an overview per continent that you can approximately take into account:

Isn't travelling around the world expensive?

A key part of planning is managing your budget. While traveling around the world can seem expensive, there are many ways to save money. Of course, the cost depends on many factors, such as when you want to travel, which countries you want to visit, and in what order you plan to travel. But it can in fact can be much more affordable than many people think.

Flights

To get the most out of your budget, we can help you find the best flight deals to make the most of your budget. Without the right knowledge, a round-the-world trip can quickly become expensive, but we know all the loopholes and can arrange flights across airlines at a very advantageous price that you wouldn't be able to find on your own.

Flight Hubs

Big hubs mean better connections and cheaper flights. Aim for: Bangkok (BKK) for Southeast Asia, Singapore (SIN) for Asia-Pacific, Los Angeles (LAX) for the Americas, Nairobi (NBO) for Africa, and Bogotá (BOG) for South America. Bonus: hubs often have low-cost airlines for regional trips, making it easier to plan a travel itinerary that spans the entire world.

Love the Long Layover

Long layovers equals free mini-adventures! Plus, some airlines have epic stopover programs. Qatar Airways: Tour Doha for cheap and enjoy amazing prices on hotel stays. Ethiopian Airlines: Explore Addis Ababa with a free hotel stay on qualifying layovers. Air China: Discover Beijing with visa-free stopovers, and you'll get a free hotel for a night on qualifying bookings!

Booking flights, hostels and rental cars together

Sometimes you can save money by booking a hostel or a rental car with your flight. We can sometimes cut significant amounts off the price of your flight, especially if you also book a hostel, a rental car, or other services. We know all the pitfalls.

Alternative transportation

It can be a good idea to consider alternative transportation options like busses, trains or ferries. This can be an exciting way to experience more destinations while saving money. Even if a flight is cheap, always weigh the cost vs. experience. A \$20 flight might seem like a steal, but an overnight train through Vietnam or a slow boat in Laos could turn into one of your most memorable travel moments.



What does a RTW trip cost per day?

Budgeting for a Round the World trip can feel overwhelming, but breaking it down by continent makes it easier. Below, we've listed average daily budgets for each region, covering accommodation, food, transport, and activities. Keep in mind that travel style (budget vs. midrange) and specific countries within each region will impact your costs.

Asia

\$30-50 per day

In general, Asia is a pretty cheap continent to travel too, and good overland and budget flight connections mean you'll have no problem hopping from place to place. Southeast Asia is the most budget friendly, while countries in East Asia have a price level more comparable to the European average.

South America

South America is a mixed bag when it comes to budget travel. Countries like Bolivia, Peru, and Ecuador are great for backpackers, with cheap food, affordable accommodation, and decent public transport. On the other hand, Chile, Argentina, and Brazil can be pricier, especially in big cities. Overland travel is an adventure, with long but scenic bus rides being the most affordable way to get around.

Central America

Central America is a great budget-friendly region, especially for backpackers. Countries like Guatemala, Nicaragua, and Honduras offer super cheap food, accommodation, and transport, while Costa Rica and Panama are pricier, especially in touristy areas. Buses are the main way to get around, and street food is both delicious and affordable. If you're into adventure, activities like volcano hikes and snorkeling are budget-friendly compared to other parts of the world.

North America

\$80-150 per day

North America is one of the most expensive continents to travel, with high costs for accommodation, transport, and food. The USA and Canada require solid budgeting, though road trips, hostels, and couchsurfing can help cut costs. Mexico and parts of Central America are much more budget-friendly, with cheap street food, affordable transport, and lower-cost activities.

In Africa, your budget depends entirely on your travel style. You can go ultra-cheap by taking local buses, staying in budget hostels, and camping—or splurge on luxury lodges in popular wildlife reserves. Safari costs vary by destination, with South Africa, Namibia, and Botswana offering the best value. A shared day safari in f.x. Etosha National Park costs around \$60 USD, making it an affordable way to experience the wildlife.

Oceania, particularly Australia and New Zealand, is known for being expensive, especially for accommodation and transport. However, budget travellers can stretch their money with campervans, hostels, and working holiday opportunities. The Pacific Islands vary widely in cost, with places like Fiji having budget options, while others lean towards luxury.

Short on budget? Consider a Working Holiday

Funding a RTW trip can be tough, but a working holiday is a game-changer. If you're between 18-30 (sometimes 35), countries like Australia, Canada, and New Zealand let you work while you travel, making it easier to fund your adventures.

Jobs are easy to find in hospitality, retail, and agriculture

You'll meet tons of travelers doing the same thing

It buys you more time to explore without burning through your savings

Why it's worth it:

Picture this—spending a year in Australia, working at a beachside café in the mornings and road-tripping down the coast on weekends. You gain work experience, make new friends, and earn enough cash to keep travelling.

A working holiday lets you balance work and adventure, giving you the freedom to travel longer without going broke. And if you don't want to commit to a full working holiday, you can also look into volunteering or work exchanges [like WWOOFing or Workaway] to cut costs.









What is a World Ticket? 💥

A world ticket is a ticket that is put together by a partnership (alliance) of different airlines. Within such a ticket you will have to fly with the participating companies. This is sometimes a difficult part, because not all airlines participate in such an alliance.

Officially, to go 'Around the World' you will have to cross the Pacific Ocean once and the Atlantic Ocean once. This can be done in an east-west direction or in a west-east direction.

The price of a round-the-world ticket is be determined one of three factors:

1. The number of miles in your route. (With so-called mileage tickets it is wise to maintain a logical order of destinations, so that your route remains efficient.)

2. The number of stopovers (intermediate stops) you make along the way

3. The number of continents you visit

You do not have to travel everything by plane, you can also choose to do certain parts of the journey over land. A world ticket can contain a maximum of 16 segments. Each segment is a flight or a portion that you travel over land. If you need more than 16 segments for your route, you can use individual tickets to supplement your trip beyond the world ticket.

Stopover vs. A stop

A stopover is any place on a flight ticket where you stay longer than 24 hours. It is therefore seen as a real destination within your ticket, where you have time to explore the area. This is in contrast to a stop, which is a stopover of less than 24 hours. Stops are often used for transfers between flights.

Note: The difference between a stop and a stopover can also affect the price of your ticket, because stopovers are often considered an additional destination within your itinerary. That is why it is smart to determine in advance where you want to stay longer and where you only want to make a short transfer.



World Ticket

Which alliances offer world tickets?

There are currently two major airline alliances that offer world tickets:

Star Alliance

The Star Alliance offers world tickets that are based on miles. There are four fare levels for mile tickets: a maximum of 26,000, 29,000, 34,000 or 39,000 miles on the route.

Changing Ticket Bookings

The standard cost for changing a world ticket at KILROY is 75 euro per person. The flight from home can be more expensive to change. Changes are only possible if there is also availability. There are only a few seats available for Round the World tickets on each flight, so being able to change to a certain date and time is not guaranteed.

You can also change the route and destinations. This is possible from 225 euro plus any price and/or airport tax difference. The new route must of course meet the conditions of the original Round the World ticket. *Please note! Changes always depend on availability.*



^{*}The Sky Team is another major airline alliance, but this group does not currently offer a world ticket.

FAQ (world ticket)

Do I always need a World Ticket for a world trip?

No, you don't. If you're just looking for connections between continents and don't need to fly that much, it can sometimes be cheaper to book individual tickets. Individual tickets may be a little less flexible when it comes to changing dates, but they can be a great solution for some trips. At KILROY, we always research the different options so that we can give you the best advice to put together a world trip.

How long is a World Ticket Valid?

All world tickets offered by the airline alliances are valid for a maximum of 12 months.

Can I book an open date?

We cannot book tickets with an open date. We can book flexible tickets where you can change your date, but there are costs involved.

Are plane tickets cheaper for children?

Children up to 1 year old pay only 10-25% of the adult fare, as long as they do not take their own seat. There is also considerably less tax to be paid. Children from 2 to 11 years old often pay 75% of the adult fare. There is often no discount on airport tax. Children from 2 to 11 years old get their own seat.

When can I book my World Ticket flights?

We can book plane tickets for your world trip up to 11 months in advance. It is therefore possible that we cannot put all your flights on the desired dates because they are too far in the future. We put these dates on the furthest possible date in order to still be able to book a ticket and guarantee a price. These flights can be changed later *free* of *charge*, as long as the date of departure from home and the route remains the same.

Can I check in online?


Nowadays you can check in online with most airlines. However, this varies per airline. It can sometimes happen with Round the World tickets that you cannot always check in online. Don't panic, that's a technical problem with the airlines. In that case you can just go to the airport, after all you have a confirmed booking.



How do you prepare for a (world) trip?

Have you chosen the destinations you want to visit? For a long journey, there is often a lot to arrange. Think of personal documents such as a passport and driver's license, but also vaccinations, visas and insurance. Make sure you leave well prepared for your trip!

We will give you a few tips:





Check that your details are correct as soon as you receive your flight tickets from us [electronically]. The names on the tickets must match the names in your passport. Also check carefully that the destinations are correct.





Your passport must be valid for at least the duration of your trip and in many countries it is even the case that your passport must be valid for 6 months after leaving the country. If this is not the case, you must apply for a new one at the town hall as soon as possible.





You also need to think about figuring out the necessary (transit) visas for your [world] trip. After all, you often cannot enter a country without the correct visa.

International Driving License




Outside the EU, you need an international driving licence if you want to participate in traffic with a scooter or car. In addition to an international driving licence, you must also take a valid Dutch driving licence with you on your trip. Moped driving licences cannot be included in the international driving licence, because no international agreements have been made about this.





When you travel far, there is a good chance that you will need vaccinations. Make an appointment with the GGD or your GP to discuss which vaccinations you need. Do this well in advance of your trip.






